1.0 Apologies

2.0 Minutes

Peter Pollock had reminded Mike Briers of his standing apology due to other commitments, which had been missed from the minutes of the previous meeting

- 2.1 **Minutes** of the Main Committee meeting held on 13th May were presented. Approval was proposed by Richard Hoad, seconded by Tony Walker, and accepted unanimously. **Matters Arising**
- 3.0
- 3.1 There has been no response from FBC to Bensteads regarding the lease extension.
- 3.2 Richard B reported on the recent meeting of the Civic Society regarding developments on the Scruples site. The CS has set themselves a budget of £160K of which they already have £130K. Apparently they have not included a screen wall between their site and RCC. MB believes that RCC should design our own wall/screen and install it as a contribution to the development of the site. There appeared to be little enthusiasm from the MC to pursue this.
- 3.3 RF reported that FBC were reviewing all of their car-parking. Apparently wardens have been instructed to enforce the restrictions once the sign is in place.
- 3.4 The Try Sailing initiative had seen 51 new sailors attending over the 6 weeks. Efforts were being maintained to convert many to club membership.
- 3.5 PTBO received a poor response from the public.
- 3.6 RCC's RYA RTC inspection would be taking place at 14.00 on Saturday the 9th July.

- 4.3 E mail from Richard Freeman to FBC (on behalf of the RNLI and RCC) regarding the condition of the jetty following damage caused by an errant cabin cruiser bouncing on the decking in the tide. Photographs and explanation of why the cabin cruiser was moved seawards on its mooring, by RCC members, had been forwarded to FBC.

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5.0 Treasurer's report

The June purchases and statement had already been circulated and there were no questions

6.0 Sailing report

- 6.1 RE reported that Don was making good progress. The MC extended their best wishes to him wishing him and a return to RCC.
- 6.2 Don's contact with FBC regarding the missing edge rails to the jetty had been overtaken by events reported at 4.3 above.
- 6.3 The Sailing Committee had postponed the works to widening the ramp down into the lower dinghy tank.
- 6.4 RJ is investigating SRC courses at RCC and making enquiries with a provider.
- 6.5 The internal layout of SB2 was being reviewed to improve access to the drain plug by moving the battery case forward and at the same time extending the seat backwards. It had been noted that SB2 was slow to plane and the committee were reviewing the shift in weight forward and whether to 'un-flood' the hull.
- 6.6 Recently during calm conditions there had been interference on the VHF radios from WLYC at Southport making it difficult for the safety boats to understand each other's communications.
- 6.7 The committee had reviewed the possibility of attaching a pick-up buoy to the large orange visitors mark, but had concluded that it would be almost impossible to do.
- 6.8 Dinghy park fees were being collected.

7.0 Training Report

- 7.1 Wednesday sessions at Fairhaven have developed from Try Sailing to more structured sailing for members.
- 7.2 Sail training is also being offered at the clubhouse on the river on Saturdays
- 7.3 Unfortunately 2 weekend training courses planned at Fairhaven did not happen, the first one had no takes and the second one may have had takers but for the club entry in the Lytham Club Day procession.
- 7.4 Instructor group actively ensuring that progress made by trainees during the Wednesday and Saturday sessions are recorded and signed-off in their RYA training books.
- 7.5 RYA RTC inspection confirmed as 14.00 on Saturday the 9th July.

8.0 Dock Report

- 8.1 The work to the perches is now complete.
- 8.2 MB is compiling letters to the Dock non payers
- 8.3 The Police are still compiling information regarding the break-in at the dock
- 8.4 No reported response from letters to Robert Marsh sent by Mike Briers and Keith Lawton.

9.0 Fabric Committee

- **9.1** The flickering light in the ladies changing room had been investigated but there was no evidence that it flickered (Post Meeting Note: at sailing on the 10.07.16 the ladies once again complained that it was flickering –possibly related to the shower use?)
- **9.2** The sailing committee asked if the front locking gate might be eased slightly to ensure that the padlock was not being stressed.

10.1 Noted that the next event was scheduled to be for the younger members organised by Simon Redfearn and Mike Lynch. However no one was aware of any plans for the event and it was assumed that it had not been organised.

- 10.3 There was still a vacant slot for the September 'Last Tuesday talk'

11.0 Development Committee

The race box access had been further discussed. It had been agreed that there was an efficiency in considering a lift/hoist access to both the main clubhouse floor level and the racebox via a common lift although the space requirements for both differed in that it was not necessary for wheelchair access to the race box.

Student Membership or full time education (18-25) was proposed in line with other local clubs, for consideration by the next AGM. £30 was felt to be in line with OOP and Associate membership
