There are a host of clubhouse events coming up in the next month or so.


Try 1940's Dancing – Lesson with Tracey.

The Dock.

Our Insurers have recently contacted the Club regarding the use of telescopic ladders (often used by cruiser owners to access their boats when on the hard).

"A newly released survey conducted by the Ladder Association expressed some very serious concerns about the availability and use of substandard ladders in the UK – in particular, Telescopic Ladders.

The report relating to portable ladders (those that fall within the scope of product standard EN 131-6) found that a shocking 82% of the ladders tested failed the required safety tests, were non-compliant and, in the majority of cases, were unsafe to use.

The Ladder Association believe that, with all telescopic ladders in the UK currently being imported, there is no safeguard against products being falsely verified as meeting UK safety standards by their manufacturer.

In fact some manufacturers have been found to consciously mislead consumers by claiming their ladders do indeed meet product standards."

Sail Training.

There were two successful Tidal Training Sessions in July, both had plenty of breeze, possibly too much for the first session nevertheless the students mastered the conditions albeit with reefed sails and we did sessions on the 'Five Essentials'. We now have a summer break returning to the tidal training on Saturday 3rd September when we'll do a 'Start Racing' session.



Sailing on the Wednesday evenings at Fairhaven continues as the evenings draw in, the final Wednesday session will be on the evening of the 7th of September. FBC have agreed that we can continue at the Lake on non-tidal weekends so we'd like to hear from you as to which of either Saturday or Sunday would suit those who are interested. We're anticipating that they will be morning sessions running from 09.30 to 12.00noon, they will be group sessions following the usual format including an element of training, providing that enough Instructors are available.

FBC will be holding a Fairhaven Regatta in September, their original date clashes with our own Regatta so they are looking to change theirs. We will be asked if we can provide some race sailing on the water so, as in other years, we are keen for the youths to have a Sunday sail session including some racing. The most likely date at the moment is Sunday 18th September, hopefully when they confirm we will send out an update to those Youth sailors who might attend.

We plan to run a members' RYA Power Boat Level 2 Course later in September or possibly early October, there are a few spaces still available, the most likely dates being the 17th and 25th of September, if you're interested or want further information, please get in touch on the email address noted above. This is a two-day course and students need to be able to complete both days.

In September the RYA Shore based Day Skipper course commences although the ever-popular RYA course run by Andrew Smith is now fully subscribed.
